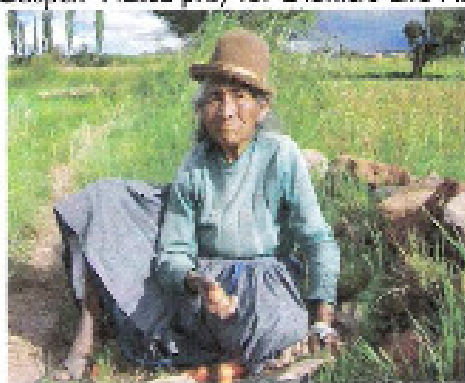
Prayer Letter Spring 2008

The rivers of Bolivia run full and swift from December until the end of March each year often leaving behind a great loss of life and property. Rainy season has finally ended and travel to remote villages has begun once again. During the past three months January through March although the rivers were too high to cross, the work of KACHI has been carried on within the villages located closest to the KACHI Center in Llallagua. The KACHI workers have been conducting training classes and workshops for believers from various denominations. They are studying and learning basic Christian Doctrine and now that the Quechua language Bible Atlas has finally been published they are teaching courses in how to use the Atlas. This is a great encouragement to the Quechua churches of Bolivia. For any of you who have ever studied a foreign language you know how difficult it is to grasp unfamiliar concepts in that language. All of these years the Quechua have attempted to study the geography of the Holy Land in Spanish rather than their native Quechua language. Your support makes it possible for them to now be taught in their native tongue through the work of this ministry.



The month of May will bring with it the reintroduction of Literacy classes. It is not always easy to find enough teachers to go out into the villages to teach reading and writing to the eager students. Literacy training is essential and we are so very thankful to First United Methodist Church of Tuscaloosa for making this outreach program possible. Please pray for the needed teachers for this aspect of ministry to the Quechua.

One of the on-going ministries to the Quechua is visits to out-lying villages for the purpose of sharing the Gospel. Please pray for Dionicio and Maritza as they make these visits. The people they talk with always have many questions. They seek clarity for their doubts and always await another visit. The Quechua do not give up their pagan beliefs easily as those beliefs are so much a part of their culture. Belief in Christ as their Savior separates them from the community in which they are a part because to become Christian means to give up their idol worship and participation in the drunken festivals that are so large a part of the Quechua daily life. By faith Dionicio and Maritza continue their visits to the Quechua people. They do not always see the result of their visits in changed and repentant hearts; never the less they continue to run the race set before them and they persevere because of their own faith. They are living the difference that Jesus has made in their lives and they want their people to have the same opportunity that they were given to hear about and accept Jesus.



We thank each of you as you continue to pray for, support, and participate in this vital ministry as we work together to reach the Quechua for Christ.
