

He's the sound coming from the far right corner of the choir loft. He directs the choir while John Ratledge is in Italy. He teaches. He drives Uber and Lyft. He's performed at the White House five times. He's working to overcome his fear of playing piano in public! He cares for two precious but aging rescue Jack Russell Terriers, Butch and Missy.

Get to know Chris O'Rear! Chris grew up in the Baptist church, the son of the long time choir director in Taylors, SC, near Greenville. He earned an undergraduate degree from Winthrop University and a master's degree in music and choral conducting from Samford University. He served 12 years in Baptist churches until he decided to teach voice at Huntingdon College in Montgomery, Alabama. He also

had a private voice studio with 14-16 high school students studying with him. He met John Ratledge at the University of Alabama School of Music where Chris received his doctorate.


"It was John who persuaded me to get back into choral directing," Chris said. "Music feeds my soul and it gives me life. It may sound corny but I hope my music does that for others, too." Chris's latest self-challenge is to play the piano proficiently. "It will make me a better teacher for my students if I can pick up and play the piano," he said. Until he played on June 28th in Traditions, he had not played in public since he was 18 years old.

His mother, father and younger sister are in the Greenville area and he has a brother in Birmingham. This fall he will be teaching voice and vocal pedagogy at the University of Montevallo in their renowned music department.

Chris just returned from Italy where he worked with singers and conductors in the symposium that John organizes each year. "Music can take you places," he said. That was a gem of wisdom that was passed onto him, encouraging him in his early career. From South Carolina, to the White House, to Montgomery, to Tuscaloosa, music has taken Chris to some wonderful places. We hope he calls this place, First United Methodist Church of Tuscaloosa, home!


