



### NICE TO MEET YOU, SHANNON CHANDLER! WORSHIP LEADER IN THE BRIDGE

### "I HAD TO GET OVER MY STAGE FRIGHT QUICKLY."

Shannon Chandler said as she told the story of being the youngest child and only daughter of a father who was a minister of music and a mother who played the piano for his choirs. "They were a package deal," she said. "And with that came opportunities for me to sing for the congregation at our small Southern Missionary Baptist Church in Glencoe.

Shannon was trained in all sorts of music—drums, violin, piano and she grew up wanting to teach music in the schools. She pursued that degree until reality hit and Alabama's education budget was cut which eliminated many of the arts programs. She didn't waste time in switching to Communications at the University of Alabama and became involved at WVUA with an award winning, student-led talk show.

Her career in communications started in radio and continued to digital billboard sales and service. In 2007, Shelton State Community College hired her and her switch to higher education administration has been successful too. She is the Chief Development Officer and responsible for donor relations, major gifts and event planning for the Foundation. This past year, under Shannon's leadership, the Foundation awarded 104 scholarships to students based on merit and financial need.

Shannon has learned that God's timing is not always our timing. When she was 17 she started competing in pageants for the scholarship money. "WHEN I FOUND OUT YOU COULD PAY FOR COLLEGE LIKE THIS. I WANTED **TO WIN."** She competed in the Miss Alabama pageant for six years and achieved top honors each time but never won THE crown. She was discouraged and considered giving up—and then rededicated herself to one last competition. That year, Deidre Downs became Miss America and Shannon was crowned Miss Alabama!

Shannon is married to Eric Chandler who grew up in First United Methodist. He brought her to church services here for the first time. Later, his father, Bryan showed a tape to the Bridge leaders of Shannon singing. Dayna Strickland recruited her to join the singers. In September 2015, Shannon was asked to take the leadership of the Worship Team. Shannon and Eric have three children, Mary Coleman (16), Evie (4) and Walt (3).

With two jobs and three children, it is amazing that Shannon finds time for anything else. "You might find this shocking but I am somewhat domestic," she admits. "I have a famous cinnamon roll recipe and I cook to relieve stress." Every holiday brings out a new stash of decorations that fill her lovely home.

Her favorite Bible verse is Galatians 6:9, And let us not grow weary while doing good, for in due season we shall reap if we do not lose heart.


