THERE ARE THREE BIG EVENTS ON THE CALENDAR FOR THE FIRST SIX MONTHS OF 2019: 1.) The General Conference of the United Methodist Church will meet in St. Louis to chart the church's future in regard to how inclusive we will be to our LGBTQ brothers and sisters. 2.) A new senior pastor will be assigned to us. 3.) On a personal note, I will retire in June.

FIRST ABOUT GENERAL CONFERENCE (GC):

Fifty years ago the GC was debating a resolution on human sexuality. From the floor of the conference an amendment was added that said the practice of homosexuality is incompatible with the Christian teaching. Since then, every four years, the GC debates the topic of homosexuality and how inclusive/exclusive we will be. In 2016, we were at an impasse. The GC postponed until 2019 any decision and created the Commission on the Way Forward to give us leadership. So complex are the issues and so entrenched are the sides, that the commission brought not one recommendation but three. On page 11, I have described each plan as presented. The GC will meet February 23-26, 2019. Serious prayers for God's guidance are being offered daily. I invite you to join the Methodists throughout the world in these prayers.

THE APPOINTMENT OF A NEW SENIOR PASTOR:

In June of 2019 a new senior pastor will be appointed to FUMCT. Our Bishop will make the appointment in consultation with our Staff Parish Relations Committee. The SPRC has developed a profile for the senior pastor and shared this profile with our district superintendent and bishop. The SPRC has met with the bishop twice and with the district superintendent three times. This is an important appointment for the conference and for the church. There are many talented pastors in our conference. The bishop and district superintendent as well as the SPRC are all praying for the right match of skills for our needs in the church. Join us in this prayer. In January, Mike Case takes the leadership of the SPRC from the able hands of Madelene Hollingsworth who has chaired the committee for the past two years.

RETIREMENT:

In February 1973, I took my first job in the church as a youth minister in Cullman. In June of 1976 I was ordained and appointed and thus began my professional career. I am grateful for the opportunity to serve God and serve my church. On June 2, I will be voted into retirement and on June 9th I will preach my last Sunday as a pastor of FUMCT. Barbara and look forward to this new season of life. I will cherish every minute of my time as your pastor and look forward to passing the baton to the new person who will follow me. I am excited about the preaching/teaching plans for the next six months. I plan to preach from some of my favorite passages:

More on General Conference (from page 1)

The Special Session of the General Conference will meet February 23-26th in St. Louis. The special meeting of The United Methodist Church's top lawmaking assembly will be limited to acting on a report by Council of Bishops, based on the proposals from the Commission on the Way Forward. The 32-member commission, appointed by the bishops, has the charge of finding ways for the denomination to stay together despite deep differences around homosexuality.

THE PROPOSALS ARE BRIEFLY DESCRIBED BELOW:

THE TRADITIONALIST PLAN

This plan keeps the current status restricting I who violates the Book of Discipline.

THE ONE-CHURCH PLAN

This plan recognizes that we have a variety of views, gives room for each expression of faith but does not define a specific view of LGBTQ. This plan gives conferences, local churches and pastors the freedom to decide what the beliefs and practices of each will be. The conference determines the standards for ministries. The local churches will decide if they will be open or closed to gay/ lesbian weddings and each pastor will decide if he or she will perform same sex weddings.

CONNECTIONAL CONFERENCES MODEL

This model keeps the core theology of our church and some of the structure. It would create three conferences in North America: one traditional conference, one progressive conference, and one centrist or "uniting" conference. Each annual conference would choose to be a member of one of the three connectional conferences based on their affinity to the conference's theological stance on homosexuality. Any local church that disagrees with the annual conference decision could vote to join a different branch conference.

The 57 page report with its 36 pages of appendices is available in English at **www.fumct.org/contact**. It is expected to be amended and revised during the sessions.

There is an initiative called Pray Our Way Forward that encourages all United Methodists to pray daily for God's leadership. Go to **UMCPrays.org** to register and watch our bishop on video explaining the initiative. A scripture and a suggested prayer topic are given each week and will be emailed to you if you register.

The special session begins in less than two months. Please pray for our church and the eight North Alabama Conference delegates to General Conference.



Her job is behind the scenes, recording the services, making videos to bring to life the work of our mission teams and putting together newsletters.

Savannah married Kaleb Smith on November 24th at Sweet Meadow Farm in Buchanan, GA. Most of you were glued to your TVs watching the Iron Bowl, but this Tennessee fan was walking down the aisle with her favorite puppy, Peyton (named for Heisman Trophy/Super Bowl winner Peyton Manning) to become Mrs. Smith.

Savannah grew up in Peachtree City, GA and attended Georgia College and State University to major in Mass Communications. She was a member of Kappa Delta and played intramural sports. She joined the Wesley Foundation on campus and served as their communications specialist.

She worked two summers at Centrikid Camps. It was at a travel camp that she met Kaleb Smith. Their team was responsible for setting up camps for children on college campuses in Tennessee, Texas, Louisiana and Alabama. Kaleb stayed on with the organization to become a camp director but Savannah spent her next summer in Costa Rica with Mission to the World. It was an organization that planted churches and she led short term mission teams in this work.

Later she worked with Freedom Challenge, a group that specializes in bringing awareness to and advocating for the victims of sex trafficking. "It was an all-women's group. We rallied women to be the voice for the voiceless victims of exploitation." Human trafficking happens all over the world but is the fastest growing illegal activity in the U.S.

Savannah started work at FUMCT a year ago. Kaleb is the Childrens' Minister at Northport Baptist Church. She, Kaleb and Peyton live in Northport. One of the most touching moments of the wedding was when the minister read from Savannah's grandfather's Bible. "Pappaw was the lead pastor at a church in Bristol, TN for over 40 years. We lost him to cancer in 2015. Having his Bible as part of the service, made it seem like he was there with us," she said.

When you see Savannah you might hum a little "Rocky Top" but be sure you thank her for the good work she does to keep us informed of everything going on in this busy church.


